University of Minnesota: China Center What's Next for U.S. - China Relations Under Trump 2.0 Sunday, March 2 at 7:00 PM Wednesday, March 5 at 7:00 PM

Competition between the U.S. - China has grown fierce in recent years, although yet to spillover into outright conflict. While embracing competition, the prior Biden administration worked to stabilize the U.S. - China relationship with "guardrails," including limited support for people-to-people exchange and even scientific collaboration. As we enter into a new presidential administration in the United States, with possibilities for disruption across a wide range of policy areas, this talk will explore the likely implications for competition, cooperation, and conflict in U.S. - China relations in the years ahead.

Neysun A. Mahboubi is Director of the Penn Project on the Future of U.S.-China Relations at the University of Pennsylvania, where he teaches various courses related to Chinese history, law, and policy, and hosts the China Studies podcast.


